

DRIFTING TROUBLES AT WBT

Trail maintenance at WBT has been a real struggle this season for both volunteers & machinery. Although the amount of snow was adequate, it was accompanied by high blizzard scale winds, creating huge drifts. On two occasions a Bobcat with tracks & snow blower had to be employed to open trails & save RSC equipment from damage. The drift management operations involved breaking up & rearranging the drifts by Bobcat, followed by several hours of grooming by RS volunteer groomers to clean up. Volunteers, all being retired, were wearing out in the process & we had to scale back grooming operations for a week or so to give them a rest & make equipment repairs.

In order of magnitude,: West Butte, Biathlon, Cherry Hills, Meadow & Snowberry presented real problems due to the size & length of drifts.. The Serbu Bobcat operator admitted it was a real challenge & we were not even sure it could be done ourselves. So it was trial & error, but the challenge was met.
